Children's Ministry Procedures As we transition to class time, we ask children 4 years to 5th grade (and their grown-ups) to please use the side door of the Fellowship Hall to enter the Children's Hallway; everyone else, use the front glass doors. Children check in with Laura before class and check out to a parent, guardian, or designated person. Thank you for helping create a Loving Community where our kids are safe, cared for, and welcomed.

Adult Ed Classes Two classes are offered, both lasting 9 weeks:

<u>1 Corinthians</u> Join Carl Holladay and Ben Fike in the Fellowship Hall Auditorium for a simple, thoughtful study of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. Together we'll work through the book week by week, listening deeply to what this letter has to say to the church today.
