**Children's Ministry Procedures** As we transition to class time, we ask children 4 years to 5th grade (and their grown-ups) to please use the side door of the Fellowship Hall to enter the Children's Hallway; everyone else, use the front glass doors. Children check in before class and check out to a parent, guardian, or designated person. Thank you for helping create a Loving Community where our kids are safe, cared for, and welcomed.

## **Adult Ed Classes** Two classes are currently offered:

<u>1 Corinthians</u> Join Carl Holladay and Ben Fike in the Fellowship Hall Auditorium for a simple, thoughtful study of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. Together we'll work through the book week by week, listening deeply to what this letter has to say to the church today.

<u>A Christian Response to 'The Anxious Generation'</u> Because technology is shaping our hearts and homes, we're learning together as a church family. A Christian Response to *The Anxious Generation* is co-taught by CMR members who are psychiatrists—John Beyer, Justin Gettings, and Luke Smith—and CMR members who are parents—Laura Rash and Brenda Peterson. This year our worship will include a Litany of Remembrance of loved ones who have died in the last year (since 11/1/2024). We will also have a Photo Board of Saints in the lobby.

Life Groups – November 2 We will celebrate Life Group Sunday on November 2 during class time, followed by a CATERED MEAL for lunch. Our discussion will focus on the story of Naaman, how he came to believe in God through the testimony of a servant girl.
